3 LIABILITY

The organizers of the event (or any of their officials or members) will not be liable or responsible for any personal injury.

Coaches and team leaders are responsible for ensuring that all participants are physically fit, prepared, and capable of coping with the tournament. We strongly recommend proper medical and accident insurance. Competitors compete at their own risk.

4 RULES AND DRAW

The following rules apply:

- JJIF competition rules (in their latest versions) and the JJIF Sporting Code version 1.2¹ (SC)
- We appeal to all participants to respect the fair-play and JJIF book of ethics

4.1 Draw modus

The seeding and draw in block will be made on **Saturday, 13 June 2026 at 20:00 hours** and will be placed online on SportData.

Major changes must be requested in relation to the following:

- At official international championships, **no redraw** is possible, except for unforeseen cases when the JJEU Sports director may decide on a redraw.
- A redraw can be requested max. 2 hours after the draw was published but, in any case, before the start of the competition, **in writing**, to the JJEU Sports Director or JJEU General Secretary.

Seeding regulations of the JJIF will be observed. For the seeding in U18/U21 and Adults, JJIF will use the world ranking list and registration to the event from **Saturday, 6 June 2026**. The JJNOs are responsible for making sure all points are correct in the raking list until this day.

4.2 Appeal and Challenge

Will be applied as defined in JJIF Sporting Code section Challenge and Appeal.

5 RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE AND CATEGORIES

Based on the JJIF SC 1.7 Entries of Competitors. Each JJNO may enter maximum 4 (four) participants per category per National Federation will be allowed. **Athletes must be personally present at the weigh-in, with their national passports or European ID cards, to prove their nationality and date of birth (no copies of the identity documents will be accepted).**

5.1 Categories

The following age divisions will be allowed to participate in this event.

U18 (+16-18)	16/17 years old	2009 / 2010
U16 (+14-16)	14/15 years old	2011/ 2012
U14 (+12-14)	12/13 years old	2013 / 2014
U12 (+10-12)	10/11 years old	2015 / 2016
U10 (+8-10)	8/9 years old	2017 / 2018

An athlete may compete in more than one age division within the same event, including across different disciplines, based on JJIF SC 2.3 Age divisions.

6 REGISTRATION AND PARTICIPATION FEE

6.2 Participation Fee

100 euro per individual fighting athlete U18/U21/Adults

70 euro per individual fighting athlete U14/U16/Masters

30 euro per individual fighting athlete U10/U12

Late entry and late payment fees will be applied.

- * Change (of an injured) competitor until registration deadline: free
- * Change (of an injured) competitor after registration deadline (in the same category): 10 euro
- * Change of the category of an athlete: 10 euro.
- * Late entry: 10 euro
- * Additional entering of a competitor on site: 50 euro

7 ANTI-DOPING CONTROL

All members should make their competitors aware that there could be doping control for several athletes. The WADA code for Doping Free sports will be applied. By entering the Championship, you accept the JJIF Anti-Doping regulations².

If you are participating in the Championship and are taking any medication or plan to take any medication, please check with your doctor whether your medicine contains any substances on WADA's Prohibited List

You will need a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) if it does. JJEU automatically recognises all TUEs issued by National Anti-Doping Agency (NADAs), so please contact your NADA if you need a TUE and do not already have one.

If you have any difficulty applying for a TUE through your NADO or there is no NADO in your country, please contact the JJIF.

8 COMPETITION DRESSING AND PERSONAL REQUIREMENTS & ADVERTISING

The JJNOs are then responsible for ordering, buying and giving the back numbers to the athletes so that they can apply them to their Gi's prior to the competition. The national federations must pay the back numbers for their athletes by themselves. Participating without an official back number is not allowed.

AIN, JJEU and JJIF athletes must order their back numbers directly per e-mail to Ju-Sports, even these are not available directly on the website.

Please observe the regulations of the JJIF as far as advertising on the Gi is concerned³.

9 REFEREES

Application: Referees can register for the event via SportsID. Specific practical information can be found in the Referee Outlines in the SportsData event page.

10 COACHES & MEDICAL PERSONNEL FROM JJNOS

10.1 Coaches

All official coaches should receive their accreditation cards during accreditation. Teams without an official coach will participate without coaching (no athlete or other officials will be allowed to enter the field of play unless they register as coaches).

10.2 Medical personnel

JJNOs may have their medical personnel. To receive an accreditation card as medical personnel the attendance at the medical meeting is mandatory.

10.3 Dress code

Coaches and medical personnel coming on the FOP must wear official team dresses. Shorts, flip-flops, hats are not allowed.

Filming (including mobile videos) inside the FOP is not allowed without press accreditation.

According to GAISF guidelines, every competitor who has won a medal must attend the ceremony in person to receive their trophy. Absence from the medal ceremony without a certified medical reasons will result in the respective athlete forfeiting the medal.

11 FLAGS AND ANTHEMS

The head of each delegation, or designated responsible of each national federation, must check the flag and the national anthem during the accreditation process.

12 FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

The organisation of the travel to Romania, the travel expenses and hotel bookings are the responsibility of the participating countries.
